## NMPRC invites New Mexicans to comment on the potential sale of New Mexico Gas Co.

SANTA FE – The New Mexico Public Regulation Commission (NMPRC) invites New Mexicans to attend a public hearing and give input on the potential sale of New Mexico Gas Company (NMGC) to Bernhard Capital Partners and other applicants. This hearing is an opportunity for the public to share input on this acquisition with the Commission, which will ultimately decide if it's in the public interest. The Commission will accept comments in-person and virtually at the hearing.

WHEN: Tuesday, October 28, 2025, from 4-7 p.m.

**WHAT:** In October 2024, a joint application was submitted to the NMPRC by Emera Inc., NMGC, Saturn Utilities Holdco, and their affiliates, requesting approval of the sale of NMGC by Emera and the acquisition of the company by Saturn Holdco. If approved, Saturn Holdco will replace Emera Inc. as owner of NMGC. The NMPRC invites residents to attend a public hearing and provide input.
